The successful candidate will be a self-starter, with strong project management skills, and you'll be particularly skilled at building, maintaining, and facilitating relationships with key stakeholders. You'll understand the importance of bringing people of all ages together at engaging events to learn and collaborate and be comfortable in delivering these. You'll have a grasp on education policy and understand the relationship between policy and practice and why we need to champion recognition and support for young carers locally and nationally.
